A View from the Pew

God's Love: From Shadow to Substance

And now then, these three remain: faith, hope, and love. But the greatest of these is love.

I Corinthians 13:13

In its October 29, 2023 issue, *Good Housekeeping* featured the article, "How to Write the Perfect Love Letter." The popular mag divided its ideas into five sections: how to start; what to include; what you love about them; tips for writing; and how to end. As Christians, we live as recipients of the One and only perfect love letter. Let's begin reading!

To start, "My dear children..." and again, "Dear friends...," "I have written this to you who believe in the Name of the Son of God, so that you may know you have eternal life" (I John 2:1, 7; 5:13).

To include, that One, God, created everything and made mankind the pinnacle of creation (Gen. 1:1, 27, 26). Furthermore, the Lord clearly declares, "For you are a people holy to the Lord your God [...a chosen people, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, a people belonging to God]. The Lord your God has chosen you out of all the people on the face of the earth to be...His treasured possession. The Lord did not set His affection on you and choose you because you were more numerous...it was because the Lord loved you..." (Deuteronomy 7:6-7; [I Peter 2:9a]).

To love—yes, what's the foundation of this relationship? "Your lovingkindness, O Lord, extends to the heavens, Your faithfulness reaches to the skies" (Psalm 36:5). There's not enough ink to praise the character (clearly identified throughout this Letter) of our Father, the One who adopted us. But, for starters, "Even before He made the world, God loved us and chose us in Christ" (Ephesians 1:4). In the comforting 23rd psalm, David declares, "He makes me lie down in green pastures" (vs. 2), basically inviting us to nestle deeply in the tall shoots of love. When David notes this, he, in effect, indicates "my Shepherd makes me (1) lie down in His finished work" and (2) rest. In the garden, Jesus (the beloved Son, one with the Father and Holy Spirit in perfect union, in Whom the Father delights) further affirms this love when He prays, "You...have loved [those You have given Me] even as You have loved Me" (John 17:23b)!

To write, now God personalizes His love letter. Since we're His children, "[we] are heirs and co-heirs with Christ" (Romans 8:17a). He "blots out my transgressions" (Psalm 51:1), for our Lord is "compassionate and gracious" (Psalm 86:15). Specifically, the Lord Almighty is "God our Savior and the Lord Jesus Christ Who gives us hope" (I Timothy 1:1b).

Yet "hope does not put <i>us</i> to shame, because God's love has been poured into <i>our</i> hearts through
the Holy Spirit Who has been given to <i>us</i> " (Romans 5:5). Moreover, He woos <i>us</i> to keep <i>us</i> from the
power of evil, to justify us (no condemnation), to provide access to God at any and every moment, to
never abandoning us. Insert your name where appropriate in any of these previous verses, as well
as here, "God showed how much He loved by sending His One and only son into the
world thatmight have eternal life through Him. This is real love —not that loved Him bu
that He loved and sent His Son as a sacrifice to take away's sins" (I John 4:9).

To end, I love you! The perfect love letter comes first as shadow (in the Old Testament) and then, ultimately, substance in the person of Jesus Christ. "Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who has blessed us in the heavenly realms with every spiritual blessing in Christ. For He **chose us in Him** before the creation of the world to be holy and blameless in His sight. **In love** He predestined us to be **adopted** as His sons through Jesus Christ, in accordance with His pleasure and will—to the praise of His glorious grace, which He has freely given in the One he loves (Ephesians 1:3-6).

Chocolate Chip Breakfast Squares To-Go

4 cups rolled oats

2 2/3 cups applesauce or mashed bananas 3/4 cup water

1 tsp salt

1/2 cup or more mini chocolate chips 1/4 cup oil, nut butter or additional water Pinch stevia, or 1/2 cup pure maple syrup, honey or agava

(if only using stevia then add an additional 1/2 cup water

2 tsp vanilla extract

Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Line a 9x13 with parchment paper.

In a large bowl stir all ingredients until well mixed. Smooth into the pan. Sprinkle additional chocolate chips on top if desired. Bake on the center rack 28 minutes. Then do not open the oven door but turn the heat off and let sit in the closed oven an additional 20 minutes. Slice into bars or squares. Leftovers can be refrigerated 3-4 days or freeze to have on hand anytime.
