Sermon Series: The Book of Nehemiah (Rebuilt, Reformed, Restored)

Sermon Recap: This sermon from Nehemiah 1 reminds us that rebuilding life's ruins begins with tears, humility, and prayer, not quick solutions. Nehemiah weeps, confesses sin, and intercedes for God's people, showing that restoration flows from trusting God's covenant faithfulness. Ultimately, Nehemiah points us to Jesus Christ, the true and better Intercessor, who bore our sin and shame to rebuild our deepest ruins and gives us hope that God will finish the work He has begun in us.

Sermon Series: The Heidelberg Catechism

Sermon Recap: Lord's Day 31 gently reminded us that Christ lovingly shepherds His church through the Keys of the Kingdom, using both the preaching of the gospel and church discipline as means of grace. Through preaching, Christ freely opens the kingdom to all who repent and believe, while also warning those who persist in unrepentance. Though often difficult and neglected, discipline is given not to punish but to restore, protect the church, and honor Christ's name. Together, these keys show that Jesus rules His church with mercy, patience, and faithfulness, calling us to live repentant lives shaped by the gospel and sustained by His grace.
