Denying Ourselves

Why did Jesus tell us "to deny ourselves, take up our cross, and follow Him" in Matthew 16:24? Denying ourselves is seeing ourselves as completely dependent on God's grace for salvation. Romans 3:23 tells us, "all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God". We seem to understand and accept that, but even after we are saved we need to realize our ability to live for Him is totally due to His grace in our lives.

What are some of the indications in our lives that we have not denied ourselves?

- -we attribute too much righteousness to ourselves
- -we take pride in our "right" character
- -we think we are wiser, more patient, more obedient, more godly than we truly are
- -we look down on others thinking they aren't as righteous as we are

The problem is when we see ourselves as righteous and mature, we don't seek God's grace in our lives which is our only hope. If we don't see ourselves as weak and needy we tend to minimize our sin. We are more concerned about the sins of others than our own sins. As long as we have hope in our own ability to be righteous, we won't run after the grace offered in Christ Jesus which we so desperately need.

The fact is we all give daily evidence in our lives of our continuing need for grace. Let's run to the only place where grace can be found "to help us in our need".

Hebrews 4:14-16 gives us insight and encouragement. "Therefore, since we have a great high priest who has gone through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold firmly to the faith we profess. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who has been tempted in every way, just as we are — yet was without sin. Let us then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need."

Pumpkin Streusel Snack Cake

3 1/2 cups biscuit baking mix

1 cup packed light brown sugar

1/2 cup granulated sugar

1/2 cup unsalted butter, at room temperature

4 large eggs

1 can (15 oz) pumpkin puree (not pumpkin pie filling)

2 tsp pumpkin pie spice

1 tsp confectioners sugar

Heat oven to 350 degrees. Coat a 15x10 inch jelly roll pan with nonstick cooking spray. In a large bowl, combine baking mix, light brown sugar, granulated sugar, butter, eggs, pumpkin and pumpkin pie spice. With a mixer on low speed, beat 30 seconds, scraping down sides of the bowl until blended. Beat on medium speed 3 minutes.

Evenly spread cake batter into prepared pan. Sprinkle streusel evenly over cake.

Bake for 30 to 35 minutes or until toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Cool completely in pan on wire rack. Cut into 24—2 1/2 inch squares; dust top with confectioners sugar just before serving.

Streusel

1 cup sweetened flaked coconut 1 cup pecan halves, chopped 1/2 cup biscuit baking mix 1/2 cup packed light brown sugar 1/4 cup (1/2 stick) unsalted butter, melted

In medium size bowl, combine coconut, pecans, baking mix and light brown sugar. With a fork, stir in melted butter until mixture is evenly moistened.
