
Things God Cannot Do: God Cannot Be Seen

Immortal, *invisible*, God only wise, in light inaccessible hid from our eyes, most blessed, most glorious, the Ancient of Days, almighty, victorious, thy great Name we praise!

With these words the hymnwriter captures (in part) the essence of our triune God. Simultaneously, he highlights a biblical truth: God cannot be seen. So, while last month we ruminated on "Things God Cannot Do: God Cannot Learn," this month we ponder a second aspect, God Cannot Be Seen.

How do we know this? In Scripture, as early as the Pentateuch, God makes the matter clear, for we read in Exodus 33:19b-20, "I will have mercy on whom I will have mercy, and I will have compassion on whom I will have compassion. But,' He said, 'You cannot see My face, for no one can see My face and live." Here the Lord unmistakably spells out for Moses that He absolutely cannot be seen. In fact, simply standing in God's presence makes the face of Moses glow, so much so that the Israelites run away in fear, begging Moses to cover his face after he speaks with Yahweh.

So, too, on the Day of Atonement, smoke fills the Holy of Holies so that the high priest cannot see God between the cherubim. Per the Lord's explicit instructions, because God dwells between the cherubim, the high priest is "to put incense on the fire before the Lord, and the smoke from the incense will conceal the atonement cover above the Testimony, so that he will not [see Me and] die (Leviticus 13:13).



New Testament writers confirm the reality of invisibility as well, which Paul expresses in multiple epistles. Twice in his first letter to Timothy, the apostle details aspects of the Lord's character. As early as I Timothy 1:17, he breaks out in doxology, "Now to the King eternal, immortal,

invisible, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen!" Then, as he comes to the end, he bursts once again into praise, extolling "...God, the blessed and only Ruler, the King of kings and Lord of lords, who alone is immortal, and Who lives in unapproachable light, Whom *no one has seen or can see*" (I Timothy 6:15-16).

Both in his gospel and his first epistle, John also affirms this truth. From the former, the NLT records these words of Jesus, in 6:46, "(*Not that anyone has ever seen the Father*; only I Who was sent from God, have seen Him)."

The question might arise, then, "If I can't see Him, *how* can I, or *can* I, even know Him?" First, Paul asserts in his letter to the saints in Colosse, "Christ is the visible image of the *invisible* God" (1:15a). Furthermore, in Hebrews 1:3a we read, "The Son radiates God's own glory and expresses the very character of God."

Exciting and also reassuring, boldly appearing this time from the pen of John, I John 4:12 declares, *"No one has ever seen God*; but if we love one another, God lives in us and His love is made complete in us."

Consequently, even though God cannot be seen, God is love, and He puts Himself on display through His adopted children. Therefore, "Immortal, *invisible*, God...thy great Name we praise!"
