God's Amazing Grace

I've read several devotionals in the last few weeks and they made me ponder and meditate again on this amazing concept of God's love for me not depending on

who I am or what I've done, but completely on who He is. Let me share with you some of what God has been showing me.

I've always tried to earn my way—and in life, that is not a bad concept. As a student you work for good grades. As an athlete you practice and train for awards and medals. As a musician it takes long hours of practice and study to be good at what you do and enjoy. You can't earn a living for your family by sitting on the couch watching TV. You earn the love and trust of the people in your life by building a relationship and being there for them. These are noble and God-honoring, I believe.

My relationship with God seems opposite of my human thinking. I think I can be good enough and earn God's love, but that just isn't possible. If I could, Jesus' sacrifice on the cross would have been totally unnecessary. And what happens when I think I can earn it? I look away from the God who loves me, concentrate on my works, and look down on others who I feel aren't doing as well at earning God's love as I am.

The parable of the Pharisee and the tax collector in Luke 18:9-14 is a perfect example. Verse 11 points out that the Pharisee prayed "about himself". He told God how good he was and how much he had done, and basically was saying how lucky God was to have him. He looked disgustedly at the tax collector, who ironically begged for God's mercy, because he saw his need for God's grace. Jesus comments in verse 14, "the tax collector went home justified." When I read this parable my mind always goes to Isaiah 64:6, "all our righteous acts are like filthy rags", and I can just imagine the Pharisee standing before God flaunting his "filthy rags". And how often do we do the same thing?

Obviously I want to love and serve God out of my great love and gratitude for His sending Jesus to save me from my sins when I didn't deserve it, not out of a sense of earning that salvation. God's grace opens my heart and spiritual eyes to see His great love for me and my need for salvation.

In closing look at Psalm 86:11-13

Teach me your way, O LORD and I will walk in your truth; Give me an undivided heart, that I may fear your name. I will praise you O LORD my God with all my heart; I will glorify your name forever. For great is your love toward me; You have delivered me from the depths of the grave.

Tomato-Avocado Salad

Ib. Roma tomatoes, chopped
cucumber, chopped
red onion, sliced
avocados, diced or sliced
4 cup cilantro, chopped
Tbsp. extra virgin olive oil
Tbsp. lemon juice
tsp. sea salt or 1/4 tsp. table salt
tsp. black pepper
