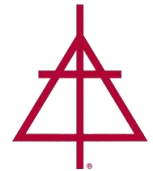

Sermon Series: The Book of Nehemiah: Rebuilding, Reforming, and Restoring

Sermon Recap: Chapter 3: Nehemiah 3 shows that God rebuilds His people not through isolated individuals but through a united and committed community. As God's people worked side by side, the wall rose because each person faithfully took part—reminding us that leadership serves by example, unity values different callings, and faith is personal but never private. The chapter also warns that spiritual indifference weakens God's work, while belonging and commitment strengthen it, teaching us that church membership is essential to God's design for building and preserving His people.

Sermon Title: Building with One Hand, Standing Guard with the Other

Sermon Text: Nehemiah 4

Sermon Outline:

1. God's Work Will Always Face Opposition from All Sides (4:1–12)
2. God Calls His People to Keep Working While Staying Watchful, Trusting Him to Fight for Them (4:13–23)

Sermon Series: The Heidelberg Catechism

Sermon Recap: Lord's Day 34 and Psalm 16 teach that the First Commandment calls us not merely to reject idols, but to rest in the LORD as our chosen portion and cup. While those who chase other gods multiply their sorrows, the believer finds refuge, joy, and security in the living God, a promise fulfilled for us in Jesus Christ, who perfectly trusted the Father and now gives us fullness of joy in His presence.
