Responsive Reading of the Law in the Light of Faith Alone (Responsively)

Leader: You shall have no other gods before me.

People: By faith alone, we trust in the one true God, who justifies the ungodly through Jesus Christ.

Sermon Series: Reformation Month: Courageous For the Faith Sermon Title: Sola Fide (Faith Alone) - The Other Prodigal Son Sermon Text: Luke 15:11–32 Part 2

I. What Legalism Really Is — The Lostness of the Older Brother A. Legalism turns obedience into a transaction.

B. Legalism blinds you to your own need for grace.

II. What True Faith Is — The Freedom of the Father's Love A. Faith begins when we stop performing and start trusting.

Sermon Series: The Heidelberg Catechism

Recap of Lord's Day 22: The sermon proclaims that the promise of "life everlasting" in John 3:16 is not merely a hope for heaven but the full redemption and restoration of all creation. Grounded in the Heidelberg Catechism, it affirms that everlasting life means the resurrection of both body and soul, the complete renewal of our humanity through Christ's victory over death. Eternal life begins now through faith, as believers already taste the joy of knowing God in Christ, and it will be perfected when all things are made new. This hope transforms how Christians live, suffer, and grieve, reminding us that because of God's love and Christ's finished work, death has lost its sting and joy will one day be full in the presence of God forever.

Sermon Title: Though My Conscience Accuses Me

Sermon Text: 1 John 3:20

Heidelberg Catechism: Lord's Day 23 1. The accusing voice of the conscience

B. Faith rejoices in the Father's joy.

2. The greater verdict of God

Reformer: John Knox (1514–1572)

John Knox, the Reformer of Scotland, proclaimed that sinners are justified by faith alone—not by works, penance, or priestly power, but by trusting in Christ's finished work. Shaped by the Reformation in Geneva, he returned to Scotland preaching that true faith receives the righteousness of Christ freely given. Though threatened by queen and crown, Knox stood firm, declaring that even the weakest faith in Christ is stronger than the might of kings. At his death, he rested not in his labors but in his Lord, trusting that salvation is by faith alone in Christ alone.

3. The peace of being declared righteous in Christ
